#### Asian snapshot



- Price cuts and incentives to prime growth
- ➤ Potential M&A and consolidation: Reports VW to buy stake in JAC, EV battery maker
- ➤ Global supplier risks and logistics disruption
- Re-escalating US trade war?



- > Japan lifts nationwide state of emergency
- Some Japanese OEM plants still shut Toyota reducing shifts on lower demand



Korea resilient – but recent increases tied to logistics centre underline risks



- India automotive plant restarts continue with plants in Pune; Maruti & Hyundai report cases
- ➤ Sector desperate for help after virtually no sales in April thus far only deferment of regulations
- ➤ Migrant labour still major issue for supply chain

## Can Europe loosen restrictions safely?



- > w/c May 25: **Toyota** (Burnaston, Kolin),
- w/c June 4: Nissan (Sunderland), JLR (Halewood), Honda (Swindon)
- Later June/July: JLR (Castle Bromwich), Aston Martin (Gaydon), FCA (Cassina, Pomigliano, Serbia), Maserati (Modena)
- Production stops/slowing: Nissan Barcelona on strike, Renault Sandouville on safety
- Plant capacity under review closures likely
- ➤ Highly uncertain demand, but most countries have reopened dealers UK June 1st
- ➤ France announced €8bn auto incentive targeting lowemission vehicles — EU programme under review
- > Logistics disruption has improved, but supplier risks are high

## Mexican leading to delays/stops in US




- Mexico restart this week: **FCA** (Toluca), **BMW** (San Luis Potosi), **Nissan, Toyota, Honda**
- > US June 4: **Nissan** (Smyrna), **FCA** (Belvidere)
- ➤ Puebla delays clearance likely setback for VW/Audi
- ➤ Production stops/slows: Mercedes-Benz Alabama on Mexico parts shortage; Volvo Cars South Carolina on parts shortage; GM truck plants delay 2<sup>nd</sup> shift on Mexico parts; Ford temporary stops on Covid cases
- Supply chain will be key as inventory runs low of profitable pickup and SUV models
- ➤ Hertz files for bankruptcy sign of fleet decline and vehicle inventory depreciation
