#### The good this week in auto supply chains...



- Gradual recovery underway (French market +1%)
- ➤ In Germany some plants up to 95% pre-crisis levels
- ➤ EV acceleration & incentives: battery & plant investments, i.e. VW Zwickau plant now 100% EV







Production ramping up to refill depleted inventory, especially of truck & SUV



- > June sales and production expected to be strong
- > **Xpeng** starts in-house production of EV model in Zhaoqing (in addition to contract manufacturing)
- > BMW Mini-Great Wall start plant construction



> Toyota ramping up Japan and global production for domestic and export recovery





#### The bad...



- ➤ Intense lockdown in Chennai extended to July 5; general lockdown in Tamil Nadu to July 31
- Ford, Renault Nissan, BMW, Daimler plants now closed until at least July 6<sup>th</sup>
- > Hyundai open w/ low output (housed workers)



- Rising cases and new restrictions in three largest
   US markets: California, Florida and Texas
- ➤ **GM** eliminates third shift from Spring Hill, Tennessee Plant to adjust to demand
- Union request GM to shut Texas SUV plant



- > Local lockdown in English city of Leicester
- VW cancels Turkey plant
- Byton halts production and plans restructure







#### ...and the unknown (could get ugly)





- > EV/low emission incentives may not support immediate sales recovery
- > EU CO2 emission fines a risk to many OEMs
- Brexit trade negotiations highly uncertain








- Many positives on digital trade, customs processes, ecommerce
- Could see rising costs to meet local content and labour rules if limited flexibility showed
- US already raises tariff threats on metals





China-US trade war, fallout over Hong Kong















#### Logistics service improving, but challenging

- Highly volatile demand and capacity planning with bullwhip risks in many regions
- Supplier liquidity better than expected but a risk many may not survive second lockdown
- Container shipping reduced schedules and fleets, higher rates...but alliance carriers financially healthy with some capacity returning
- Air freight capacity remains limited, with small improvements
- Automotive rail freight network still being restored in North America and Europe
- Lack of transparency on service, local regulation, customs compounding issues

Model and market priority in supply chain planning and scheduling:

Build 'blue' instead of 'grey' cars


- VW to prioritise production of vehicles with end customer orders (blue) over stock orders (grey) to cut delivery time, reduce vehicle stock and improve supply accuracy
- Toyota prioritising demand and product mix for US retailers in Japanese plants over other regions
- Europe to push production and imports to gain EV incentives and meet CO2 targets
- Depends on closely integrated and dynamic planning and data exchange




Will crisis accelerate digital transformation across the supply chain?

Production and logistics opportunities:

- Real-time visibility and IoT connectivity
- Digital freight booking and contracting
- Dynamic asset and network planning tools
- Paperless and contactless delivery processes
- Digital twins (supply routes, facility layout, network)
- Robotic process automation
- Automated handling and warehouse operations
- ...from descriptive to predictive data analytics
- ...the path to AI and self-driving supply chains



## Crisis compounds challenges to connected production & logistics



- Legacy systems & IT infrastructure
- Proliferation of software systems and standards
- Bottlenecks in data interface and exchange
- Poor sharing and visibility of forecast & plans
- Cost to connect older assets and equipment
- Cybersecurity
- Lack of in-house competencies in software




