

Global snapshots of the week







- > Daimler to sell smart factory in France
- > BMW, VW investing in EV & component production



- ➤ US market -30% June (+17% used cars)
- > Auto rail shipments trebled from May to June
- > Pickup inventory low: vehicles sold during transport
- > Returning restrictions a risk to sales recovery



- > June sales +11% in third straight monthly rise
- Daimler to take equity stake in Chinese battery maker Farasis



- ➤ Japan June sales -23% in June
- ➤ India June sales -54% with ongoing restrictions
- ➤ Brazil June -38% cars, -19% commercial vehicles









Sustainability drivers in supply chain

- Emissions targets and regulations in transport and energy Paris Climate Agreement, 'Green New Deals'
- Alternative fuels and powertrains including trucking (CNG, electric, fuel cell) and shipping (low Sulphur, LNG, etc)
- Digitalisation and connectivity in production & logistics
- Waste & energy reduction returnable equipment, zero to landfill, rainwater usage, renewable energy, carbon offsetting
- Government investment and incentives, i.e. fleet renewal, critical infrastructure can the Covid recovery be a green renewal?
- Changing customer and corporate values and impacts on procurement
- Cost reduction

Challenges in sustainable automotive logistics

- Complexity and lack of transparency
- Long distance, resource-intensive transport
- High levels of disruption & changes in production
- Varying equipment and standards
- Under-utilised transport assets
- High costs and unwillingness/inability to invest
- Low priority, perhaps especially post-Covid



- What can companies do today to make real reductions in emissions?
- How should emissions and sustainability considerations influence purchasing decisions?
- What role can digital tools and technology play?
- Will automotive manufacturers pay more for more sustainable supply chains?
- How much are companies willing to collaborate on greener logistics and supply chains?
- How will 'green new deals' influence and shape transport and logistics?

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


